

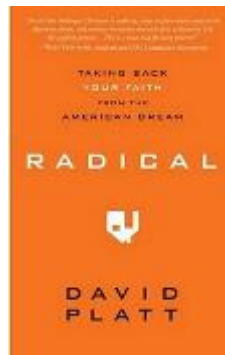
## Book of the Month Radical —David Platt

## Senior Minister's December 2011/January 2012 Pastoral Letter

Dear sisters and brothers,

Sue and I want to thank all those who so faithfully prayed for us during our recent Long Service Leave. We had a spectacular time with a good balance of rest, recreation, reading, reflection, ministry and spiritual input. I also want to put on public record my thanks to Shane Dirks (locum), Bill France and the rest of the staff who clearly did a sterling job while we were away. It brought us both great joy to see things just continuing without missing a beat and we were filled with thanksgiving for the magnificent generosity shown towards the gift appeal for the roof replacement.

Of course, ministry goes on and we now rush headlong into the Christmas Season and all the wonderful opportunities it affords for outreach to our community. Therefore, we'll soon be asking you to once again distribute our Christmas Postcards and advertising for the special Festival and Carols Night at West Pennant Hills Public School on Friday 16 December. The postcard this year focuses on the theme **'HOPE from God'**. As we enter the church season called Advent (Coming) I thought I would share some challenging and encouraging thoughts on the theme of HOPE recently sent to me from my US mentor, Leighton Ford. I trust you will find them as edifying as I did:

"Sometimes all you can do is hold hope for someone, until they can take it and hold it for themselves." A young colleague made this remark as we spoke over lunch about hope. The phrase struck home to me – **"hope-holders"** - isn't that what followers of Christ are supposed to be?

I think of Peter's admonition: *"Always be ready to make your defence to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you"* (1 Peter 3:15). I picture Paul, sailing to Rome when the ship is caught in a violent storm and near foundering. After every possible measure is taken, and the storm still rages, Luke records *"all hope of our being saved was at last abandoned."* Then Paul stands up, and tells them not a life would be lost, for an angel had come telling him not to fear, that he would indeed live to stand before the emperor. *"So keep up your courage,"* he says, *"for I have faith in God that it will be exactly as I have been told. But we will have to run aground on some island"* (Acts 27:20-26). Paul was no preacher of positive thinking, or a prosperity gospel. Danger and death would still come. But, with his trust in the word of God, he was a true hope-holder.

And what more could we hope to be as people of hope this Advent?

**What then is hope? And what difference does hope make in how we live?**

- *Hope is a strong and confident trust*, given by the Holy Spirit and nurtured in life experience, that God, who has promised good to us and all creation, makes good on his promises through Jesus' coming and coming again.
- *Hope deepens our longings* – turning our wishes into a desire for what is truly good, beautiful, and eternal.
- *Hope trusts our longings into God's merciful hands*, knowing that he is wiser than we, and able to do above what we can ask or even think.
- *Hope expands our horizons* setting our desires into a wider and longer picture. Like stone masons fitting stones for a cathedral, we see only the small section assigned to us, yet know ours is part of a great purpose.
- *Hope reframes our losses*. "Reframe," a psychological term, describes the power of hope to give a new perspective, and open new possibilities. As we "hold hope" for others we pray they may also be given grace to see how God can bring gain out of terrible loss.
- *Hope binds our own future to that of Jesus Christ*. Whatever storms come we can know with comforting certainty "*that I, body and soul, both in life and death, am not my own, but long belong unto my faithful Saviour Jesus Christ.*" (Heidelberg Catechism).'

Of course the Christmas message is about God coming amongst us in order to restore sinful humanity into fellowship with our Creator. It is truly a message of 'Hope from God'. Hope of forgiveness. Hope of reconciliation. Hope of eternity. What a wonderful message of HOPE Christmas is, and it's one worthy of also carrying into the New Year.

Sue and I want to wish all the St Matt's family a very holy and special Christmas in which the message of HOPE sinks deeply into our spiritual DNA so that we dynamically, and yet naturally, speak of our eternal relationship with God in Christ. We also trust that the New Year will bring much blessing and joy to you and all your family. If you are travelling over the Christmas and New Year holiday season please drive carefully and we'll look forward to seeing you on your return.

They are a wonderful team and we wish them every blessing as they move to St Paul's Castle Hill in the New Year to a senior role overseeing the ministry to 3-23 year olds. We'll have an official farewell lunch for them on 18 December immediately after the

Pageant Service at St Matt's. I hope you will come along for this special event.

Chris and Claire Jones have been around St Matt's for a lot longer than myself and have readily served the life of our church with special focus on our Youth Ministry. CJ, as an unpaid minister and more recently as a paid member of staff, the youth of our church and wider community, with great energy, enthusiasm and care. He has an eye for detail and has ensured that the Youth ministry has been biblically solid and organisationally strong. He has also preached with careful detail to the text and appropriate application. Claire in this past year added to her ministry quiver the role of Church Warden, bringing her lawyer mind and skills to the task. 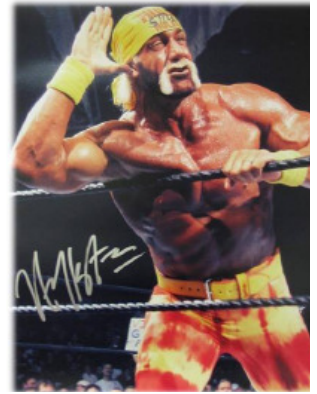
Please be praying for all of these ministers and their families as they complete one ministry and transition into a new one.



### 2011 - A year for which we have much to thank God

There is a real difficulty in preparing an update at the end of November, none of the final financial information is available, work is in progress on the preparation of the 2012 budget but nothing is yet finalized.

It is however, worth casting our minds back to the beginning of 2011 when the wardens presented the congregations with a difficult, unbalanced budget.

You may remember how we tried to explain the need to find \$60,000 in cost savings just to balance the budget. I also recall the difficulty of highlighting the fact that our offerings were not sufficient to cover the costs of essential services and stipends. In short there was a direct plea that we all needed to more generous and regular with our monetary gifts.

The result: a year with strict control over expenses, some unexpected short term savings in stipends, but most of all a significant increase in offertories both in total, and on a per family basis. Thank you! Your generosity will allow us to be more confident about our future planning.

On top of all that, there was your response to the Gift Day Appeal - Let's Fix the Roof!

Your generosity has provided over \$100,000. Unfortunately there is insufficient time to thoroughly assess all the options and quotes and to issue firm contracts before the end of the year. Our plan is to hold a general information meeting for those interested from all congregations in either late January or early February 2012. This meeting will provide an opportunity for discussion and feedback on the warden's initial recommendations with the intention of having the work carried out around March 2012.

We bless the Lord for everything that He has done for us. I hope all of you are fine and carrying on the wonderful work of Jesus.

Here is some of the mission work over here in Kenya in 2011:

- ♦ The Pastor's house was completed
- ♦ The High School was fully registered by the government and 33 graduated and 20 have joined universities and colleges
- ♦ There were 3 outreach missions - one to South Coast (Mombasa), another to Uganda (Soroti), 6 within Nairobi whereby a total of 2,800 souls received Christ as Lord and saviour.
- ♦ At the Primary School, 78 graduated and 60 joined high schools and vocational training schools.
- ♦ 150 people were baptized at various 9 mission outreach points and 22 children were dedicated to Christ.
- ♦ Kibera Baptist Church School enrolled additional 30 pupils to make a total of 150 pupils
- ♦ Embul bul Baptist Church school enrolled additional 25 pupils to make a total of 85 pupils.
- ♦ The Kamidakan Baptist Church Bible School graduated 4 pastors and enrolled 12 new ones, 2 of whom are women.
- ♦ We visited 11 churches in Australia, September-October 2010 - launched the book "God is my Employer" and the "10 year plan 2011-2021"
- ♦ 2011-2012 plans - we would like to buy at least 17 acres of land at a cost of Kshs.13,600,000 to be used for setting up a mission headquarters, build a pioneer building Kshs. 5,000,000 for vocational/income generating centre and progressively set up the primary/high school/ vocation/recreational youth centre with agricultural production facilities. We also look forward to train 10 young men on various disciplines to enhance mission outreaches and in addition to that purchase a 4-wheel drive at a cost of Kshs. 1,500,000 to drive in muddy roads.- Thanks for your fervent prayers and financial support for the year ending 2011.

## A **'RADICAL'** Start to 2012

During my Long Service Leave I read several, among them, two books by David Platt, 'Radical' and 'Radical Together'. David is the Baptist Senior Minister of a Mega-church 'with a difference' in Birmingham, Alabama. I say with a difference for David is challenging this once comfortable middle class multi-million dollar building church to face squarely the radical comprehensive claims of Jesus Christ on believer's lives. David is unsettling the middle class American church dream by placing it alongside the disturbing teaching of Jesus about discipleship. Reflecting on the images he saw in his church and the pictures still fresh in his mind from mission trips in impoverished, persecuted churches overseas, David writes, *'I could not help but think that somewhere along the way we had missed what is radical about our faith and replaced it with comfortable. We were settling for a Christianity that revolves around catering to ourselves when the central message of Christianity [from Jesus] is actually about abandoning ourselves.'* I found both these books very challenging and I have been caused to assess just how seriously I take the **'RADICAL'** claims of Jesus over my life.

I felt led, I believe of God, to return from my leave and put in place for February through March a series based on Jesus/God's teaching around the six topics and studies David Platt addresses in 'Radical Together'. The current staff enthusiastically embraced this idea and so we are going to do everything in our power to saturate St Matt's with this series. From our children's ministry through youth, young adults, 'Community Groups' and adult 'HOME Groups' not to fail to mention our Sunday preaching, this series, 'Radical Together' will be studied and reflected on. I invite all of us to buy in and participate. The first book Radical will be our book of the month for February but it will be available for sale in early December for those who want to get a head start on reflecting on some of the essential ideas of radical discipleship.

Now, speaking of **'RADICAL DISCIPLESHIP'**, I also want to inform you that at our staff planning meeting in November the idea of having a yearly theme for our Christian community @ St Matt's was floated. We all warmed to the idea and so for 2012 our theme for the year will be **'RADICAL DISCIPLESHIP'**. I'm really excited about this series because above everything else I want to be aligned with Jesus' understanding of discipleship and not be content with the 'comfortable discipleship' I can so easily slip into. Please be praying for my preparation of this special series of studies and sermons over the next two months.
