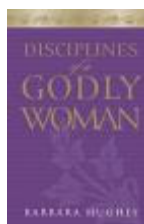
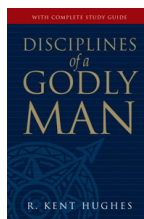
The November book is being repeated this month, due to the book shop closing for the holidays.

Minister's Pastoral Message – Matts Matters December/January

Dear sisters and brothers,

Well, it's hard to imagine but by the time you're reading this letter it will be just over two weeks to Christmas. Where did the year go? I do know it appeared to race by. Its been a year filled with exciting and effective changes (the Chinese and Asian congregations moved to Cherrybrook Public School, we launched a new congregation St Matts @ School at West Pennant Hills Public), there were two special outreach campaigns (Connect09 and 'Jesus All About Life') and of course the inevitable challenges – what might be termed the speed humps of Christian ministry. Its been a year when our attendance has grown across nearly all our congregations, through people coming to Christ, babies being born and Christians choosing to make St Matts their spiritual home. In a year of global financial crisis, while not yet quite making our 'stretch' budget we've managed to maintain a reasonably healthy balance sheet and we may yet reach our target. Of course we have the Lord God to thank for all these blessings and it's to him we must continue to look as we move into the second decade of the 21st Century and continue our mission to be a church which *'reflects the generosity of Christ in and to our community'*.

Of course we all know Christmas is upon us. Its obvious from the tree in our foyer and annoyingly, at least for me, as our letter boxes get filled everyday with an amazing array of advertising catalogues. It's amazing there are any trees left to hang lights on!! At times it doesn't feel like CHRISTmas but Santamas, as the commercialisation of the season seems to escalate year by year.

The cartoon below captures something of the paradox that is Christmas in the Western world. The carols we sing of the holy birth of the most significant person in human history can be so easily drowned out by the hustle and bustle of present shopping. May we ensure Jesus is neither obscured nor replaced as the centrepiece of both our Christmas and the rest of our lives. May we, like the Apostle Paul, recall the wonder

and mystery of Christmas recorded for us in 2 Corinthians 8:9:

'For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake became poor, so that you, through his poverty might become rich.'



The message of Christmas isn't about the generosity of stores providing specials BUT the generosity of God in sending his special one-of-a-kind divine Son to Earth. Why? Well, as the text declares, humanity was dwelling in spiritual poverty. Even a cursory glance across our society and globe testifies to our ongoing spiritual bankruptcy before a holy and righteous Creator God. We all like sheep have gone astray and everyone needs to have the generous and compassionate Shepherd, Jesus Christ find us and bring us home into the presence of the holy God. This of course was achieved by the heavenly Son of the cradle becoming the Christ of the Cross, and the Crowned King of the empty tomb. By Jesus poverty we can receive the riches of forgiveness, friendship with God and a future in glory. What a breathtaking gift God has provided in the Christ child.

Therefore, let's ensure that during this Christmas holiday season we don't allow our Lord to be marginalised, placed as it were on the shelf until life returns to some normality in February. Rather, let's give substance to the words a little girl uttered as her parents were setting up their nativity scene. She said, *'Make sure Jesus shows!'* A timely reminder as we wind up an old year and begin a new!

Over the next two months we'll say farewell to Andrew and Jo Lewis (Dec 25) and welcome to Nerida Peart (Jan 18). We say thanks a heap to the Lewis's for all that they have contributed to our life at St Matt's, it's been a joy and privilege to have you with us over the past two years. And to Nerida we say "welcome". We're excited about all that you will bring to us by way of grace gifts, vision, energy and enthusiasm. Please be praying for Andrew & Jo and Nerida as they make their respective transitions into new ministries.

Finally, on behalf of myself, all the staff and our spouses I would wish all our regular parishioners, newcomers and guests a very Holy Christmas and a New Year rich in the spiritual blessings of our great God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. If you are travelling on holidays over the summer please drive safely and return to us or your own home, refreshed and ready for another year of worshipping our generous Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

The 10 am Service Resource Group

This group has been meeting regularly for the past two years with the aim to support and develop the 10 am Service. A key focus has been seeking to ensure that our service is *“reflecting the generosity of Christ in and to our community”*.
