


Book of the Month

Life began as the unloved, eldest son of a teenage mother in what is now Zimbabwe. Abandoned at the age of 7, scavenging for food and sleeping under a bridge, Stephen's only home was found in the Black Shadows street gang. Then a night that began with petrol bombs, ended with a life changed forever by the love and power of Jesus.

Immediately an evangelist that couldn't stop sharing Jesus with anyone who would listen, Stephen's subsequent journey of mentoring, marriage, joys and sorrows makes compelling reading. Time after time God's work in his life was nothing short of breathtaking – right to last page! **Cost: \$ 20.00 each**

Minister's Pastoral Message – Matt's Matters March 2010



Dear sisters and brothers,

One of the constant refrains in the Scriptures is that Christians should love one another. This love (agape) is that quality of self-sacrifice given for the best interests of others and most spectacularly demonstrated by our Lord Jesus Christ on the cross. As is crystal clear from Christ's cross, such love is not just a nice warm feeling we might have towards another person but is to be practical in demonstration. One of the ways the New Testament actually commands this to be done is by way of '**hospitality**'. So we read for example in:

Romans 12:9-13 'Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in brotherly love. Honor one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer. Share with God's people who are in need. **Practice hospitality.**'

Hebrews 13:1-2 'Keep on loving each other as brothers. Do not forget to entertain strangers, ...'

And again

1 Peter 4:8-9 'Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling.'

So we see that love and hospitality are linked in all three passages. The Greek word translated as hospitality, literally means '**love of strangers**'. The implication is that our homes, meal tables, indeed all our resources should be openly extended to those outside of our own family. Hospitality in the first century was an essential responsibility for congregations who had no building of their own and where many Christians were slaves, widows and poor needing support and aid. Therefore, home meetings were a basic unit of their shared Christian community life. There were also traveling preachers, so it was important to be ready and willing to generously provide hospitality for these gospel ministers. John commends a dear Christian friend Gaius for such activity in 3 John 5-6 '*Dear friend, you are faithful in what you are doing for the brothers, even though they are strangers to you. They have told the church about your love. You will do well to send them on their way in a manner worthy of God.*' Also notice there is no gender attachment to this ministry, it's for all Christians.

However, the need for such ministry hasn't dissolved in the 21st century. In the parable of the Sheep and the Goats (Matthew 25:31-46), a parable about the final judgement, Jesus condemns some and commends others on the basis of their care, visiting and hospitality towards fellow Christians, including the stranger, who is unknown to us (25:35, 43). The text asserts that such activity reflects the reality of our attitude towards Jesus. Nothing has changed. Hospitality is a command of God to all believers and our responses will mirror the genuineness or not of our faith in Christ. So let's be encouraged to open our homes and hearts to both members and visitors to our congregation as a practical expression of our love.

Yet some may ask, 'How can we do this? Where do we begin? How can we afford to do this? Let me give some suggestions. Start simple and organize an inexpensive morning or afternoon tea; remember it's not the food and drink which is important but the fellowship shared around it. Then again you could arrange a no fuss dessert and coffee evening for a small number for a relaxed time of conversation and sharing. Those with the resources and skills could organize a midweek or weekend meal at their home. Others with fewer resources could plan a bring-your-own BBQ or potluck meal. It has been our experience that most people are only too willing to contribute when someone else takes the initiative.

The next question is, 'Who should we invite?' It's certainly easy to open our homes to existing friends and there is of course nothing wrong with this. However, we need to remember hospitable people according to the New Testament, are '*lovers of strangers*'. All too often it is the newcomer, single parent, widowed, divorced, disabled, socially difficult, quiet, smokers, non-Christian, etc. who are left out of the hospitality circle in churches. Let's be lovingly bold and reach out with generosity, kindness and patience, opening our homes and hearts to those in our fellowship we don't know and to our unchurched neighbours. Let's not be concerned about what others might think about our cooking, dinnerware, etc, but simply extend the love of God to others, that we might build Christ's church by encouraging fellow believers and embracing unbelievers. How strategic this will be in the rest of April and May as we especially focus on evangelism during this period.

Those currently outside the orbit of our fellowship and church are less likely to accept a cold-turkey invite to an outreach event or guest service than one that is extended within the context of a friendship regardless of how new that friendship may be. So let's all get cracking and work out how we can most effectively exercise hospitality. Remember this ministry isn't a matter of personal choice but of practical obedience to our Lord and one which Hebrews 13:2 reminds us could lead to a situation of unusual blessing, '*Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some people have entertained angels without knowing it.*' Food for thought, don't you think?



St Matt's Young Adults Community Update, *by Chris*

In the 10 years that I have been involved in Young Adults Ministry at St Matts, never have I felt such a buzz of energy and excitement. Many years of prayer and hard work by previous ministers responsible for YA, and their leadership teams, have brought us to this point. We have just had the best attended YA camp in memory and launched the year of YA Home groups with near to 120 young adults meeting weekly to open the word together. The YA community is excited and chomping at the bit to answer the call from Nerida to be an engaged and involved community, eager to serve God, to serve each other, and to serve and reach out to the world around us.



As I look back over my time in YA, I am greatly encouraged to see the change that has occurred. St Matt's has long had a very strong youth ministry, but previously, once people finished school, they left St Matt's, either for other churches or walking away from faith all together. We now have a thriving Young Adult community, one which year 12 students look forward to becoming a part of once they finish school. Young adulthood is a major time of change and a time of great temptation. For me, being a part of YA has been crucially important to my faith and has held me steadfast as I moved into uni, then into the workplace. It kept me focused on Christ through career changes, through relationships and relationship breakdown. It has been where my theological knowledge has been stretched and where my heart has been taught to serve. This has all been done through the love of God being shared amongst peers to support, encourage, teach and rebuke one another. For this I am immeasurably thankful to God.

The arrival of Nerida has resulted in heightened enthusiasm and anticipation for the future, sharing with us her vision for the future of YA. Looking inward: to Pastorally care for one another, building a strong sense of community and fellowship, and a strong focus on growing our knowledge and understanding of the scriptures and their application to our lives. Looking outward: outreach to our friends and family, being active in mission, both locally and overseas through getting involved in beach missions, supporting link missionaries and going on short term mission trips; caring for those in less fortunate circumstances and being aware and involved in matters of social justice. And it is from this vision and ownership of it that the excitement stems. The YA community is looking to grow in fellowship with one another, spend time getting to know other people better and be open to talk about our faith. There has been great excitement about the start of HOME groups, as people talk about their new groups and how they are going. People are volunteering, eager to serve as YA strives to grow in depth and number, and to reflect the generosity of Christ in and to our community.

Young Adults Prayer Points:

- Pray for YA community, that this energy and enthusiasm will continue and the vision for the future can become a reality.
- Pray for the new HOME groups which have been meeting for about a month. Pray that people will have genuine fellowship in their groups and quality learning from God's word.
- Pray for more leaders to be raised up for HOME groups, particular older leaders.

"Out of the Black Shadows" – the Story of Stephen Lungu


I first met Stephen Lungu in Harare in January 2010. The forum was a series of important meetings for the African Enterprise leadership team, the organisation that Stephen leads as CEO. It was my privilege to get to know Stephen, someone I had heard about and was looking forward to meeting.

It is impossible to spend time with Stephen without being impressed by the obvious impact of the gospel on his heart and character. My subsequent reading of 'Out of the Black Shadows' gave me a deepened appreciation of Stephen's background and of the wonderful transformation that God brought about in his life.

'Out of the Black Shadows' is the story of Stephen Lungu's life from birth, up until 2006 when Stephen became the CEO of African Enterprise. It is a human drama, an African drama and a God drama. It is a human drama in that it deals with the devastating impact of a dysfunctional family on a young life, an African drama in that the setting is the impoverished urban communities that characterise Africa, and a God drama in that the book gives account of the life-changing impact of the gospel on a young life.

The narrative of the early years of Stephen's life helps the reader to enter into Stephen's life struggles. The reader gets a real sense of what it is like for a child to be rejected, unwanted, and alone. This part of Stephen's story is intensely sad. The scene is set for the love of God to reach down into Stephen's ruined life and bring about a wonderful change in his heart and life. Stephen's conversion is remarkable in its timing and its effect. The balance of the book gives a simple account of the immediate and ongoing transformation of Stephen's heart and life. We see how the call on Stephen's heart to share the good news of Christ finds expression in his work with the Dorothea Mission initially, and thereafter with his work with African Enterprise. The reader is taken on Stephen's personal journey of life, marriage, family and work with a refreshingly honest insight into Stephen's challenges and struggles. We gain a sense of a broken man with a humble heart whom God loves without reservation.

I commend 'Out of the Black Shadows' to you. The book will enrich your life.

St Matthews Chinese Congregation

It was a wonderful opportunity for us to join the EE3 (Evangelism Explosion III) combined churches street evangelism on 27/3. There were all together about 70 people in our group – one of the seven groups comprised of many different Chinese churches. We started at 11 am and had an hour of worship together before we divided into teams of three and went to different areas, such as Castle Mall, Cherrybrook Shopping Village, Pennant Hills Station, Carlingford Village, and Eastwood, giving out gospel tracts and sharing the gospel with people there.

We representing St Matt's also gave out the Easter postcards to people. Some of us met some of our St Matt's people on the streets and they gave us their encouragement for which we have to give thanks to them. We finished at 4pm and then we had our report and sharing of experience during evangelising to people on the streets.

Most people had their chance of sharing the gospel to people on the streets. Though there were only four people from our group who made their commitment to Christ, it was indeed a good experience for us in giving testimonies to strangers on the streets and seeing that it is “not by might nor by power, but by God’s Spirit” that people were willing to repent and believe the gospel.

大多數弟兄姊妹都有機會與人分享福音。雖然我們的西北組只有四人信主，但能夠向街上的陌生人作見証傳福音，對我們是一個好經歷，亦讓我們見到人的悔改和信福音，完全“不是倚靠勢力，不是倚靠才能，乃是倚靠神的靈方能成事。”


