

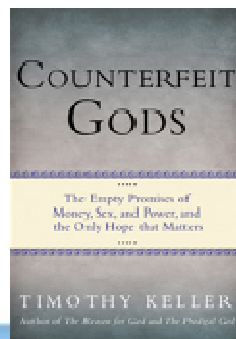
Book of the Month

COUNTERFEIT GODS by Timothy Keller

Cost: \$ 16.95

Tim Keller knows how to tell a Bible story. Like *The Prodigal God* before it, his latest book, *Counterfeit Gods* is built around them. And every time I read one of those stories, I feel like I am hearing it for the first time. I find myself lost in the story, anticipating how it could, how it might, end. In the back of my mind I know exactly how it will turn out, but somehow Keller takes me along for a ride as he tells these stories in such a fresh way. In *Counterfeit Gods* he tells of Abraham and Isaac, Jacob and Esau, Jonah and Zacchaeus. Each one of these characters and the stories of their lives are used to teach the reader about the prevalence of idolatry in the Bible and in the human heart.

Pastoral Letter—Steve Abbott

Dear sisters and brothers,

Is it June already? Apparently so. My, how quickly this year has gone by! It has been terrific to watch Nerida, our Young Adults minister hit her straps and already make significant contributions to our community. Also at the beginning of May Shane, Rachel, Levi and Mia Dirks landed on our fair shores and in just a few short weeks have demonstrated a willingness to minister with servant hearts, making a wonderful start at both StMatts@School and the 5pm congregations. Finally, on Monday 31 May, Kat Butler commenced as our office administrator. She comes to us with outstanding references and a mature commitment to both the Christian faith and gospel ministry. She and her husband, Daniel, are involved in the Youth Ministry at St John's Anglican Church Asquith and will continue to be members of that church. We welcome Kat to our staff and look forward to a long and fruitful ministry as part of our team. Tina continues as our one day a week Communications Officer, working closely with Kat. We ought to be very thankful to God for His provision of these new members of staff and keep them in our prayers as they continue to settle into their relatively new roles.

I am pleased to be able to share that we have concluded the fine-tuning of our values and we now have them in a final form, which both staff and Parish Council have agreed to. Two of our members, Rob and Chris McGregor, who are accomplished wordsmiths, have provided some professional feedback and their comments have been incorporated into the final form of the values. One major change has been reducing the number from 8 to 7. The last value, '**Unstinting graciousness in all our relationships**' has been assimilated into our third, '**Unreserved commitment to love people impartially**'. This makes good sense and the seven remaining values do have a helpful flow and sequence to them. So our values now look like this:

Our Values

In order to fulfill our vision to '*reflect the generosity of Christ in and to our community*', we at St Matt's commit to live as a congregation of God's people according to the following values:

Unrelenting prayer to God

Undying devotion to the Word of God

Unreserved commitment to love people impartially

Unquenched heart for evangelism

Unfading resolve to mature as Christians

Unfailing commitment to work together as a team

Untiring determination to train, send and support servants of God.

Below is the longer statement, which explains each of these seven in more detail and provides biblical foundations for them.

Our Values Explained

Unrelenting prayer to God – Everything we do at St Matt's begins in dependent prayer to the God who is Father, Son and Holy Spirit. In 1 Timothy 2:1-6 the apostle Paul makes prayer the first priority of the Christian community and in doing so brings the church into line with Jesus' own persistent commitment to prayer throughout his earthly life. So we align ourselves with our Lord and his apostle's priority and give ourselves to persistent, prayerful dependence on God (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18).

Undying devotion to the Word of God – Everything we do at St Matt's flows from our commitment to live in obedience to the God-breathed Scriptures as contained in the 66 books of the Bible. We believe these provide all we need to be fully furnished for ministry in the world in terms of salvation, right doctrine and right behaviour (2 Timothy 3:15-17).

Unreserved commitment to love people impartially – Everything we do at St Matt's is motivated by the compassion and graciousness God showed us in Christ. We love because he first loved us (1 John 4:7-21). The selfless servant love of Christ unites us in a fellowship of faith creating a safe environment and community where everyone is valued and treated with respect and dignity. We want to be courteous and generous in our speech and behaviour, always seeking to encourage and build up, not discourage or tear down. We take every opportunity to connect with grace and care for people with whom we interact (Galatians 6:10).

Unquenched heart for evangelism – Everything we do at St Matt's fulfils our intent to bring people to Christ. We believe God's call on our lives is to bridge the gap between the generous God and the bankrupt world of the lost (1 Peter 2:9-12). So we reject complacency and embrace conviction, proclaiming the gospel of the dying and rising Christ Jesus in every circumstance and at every opportunity (2 Timothy 4:1-5). Evangelism involves words and works; therefore we seek to exemplify the transformative power of God's good news, living attractive lives empowered by the Holy Spirit (Philippians 2:14-16). We desire to be a church of irresistible influence for Christ (Matthew 5:13-16).

Unfading resolve to mature as Christians – Everything we do at St Matt's reflects our resolve to be disciples who demonstrate our faith in every aspect of our lives. We 'walk the talk' (Matthew 28:18-20, Colossians 1:28). Our purpose is to ensure our confessions of faith are authentic, matched by our actual practice. Consequently we encourage each other to be reading and applying the Scripture's teaching and morality to every situation in life: relationships, study, career and leisure. We understand this isn't an individual activity but something we do in community, ministering the word of God to one another and spurring each other to live and speak as God intended (Colossians 3:15-17).

Unfailing commitment to work together as a team—Everything we do at St Matt's we do interdependently, with patience and a forgiving spirit. The New Testament's teaching about the Body of Christ is taken seriously, so we encourage and equip all Christians to embrace a shared, apprenticeship pattern of service. No one is insignificant. Everyone can contribute, so we endeavour to minister in community with others, not in isolation from them (Ephesians 4:7-16). We also highly value and affirm the significant contribution our members make both in the workplace and the church and this regardless of gender or generation or ethnicity.

Untiring determination to train, send and support servants of God – Everything we do at St Matt's seeks to encourage Christians to serve in God's place in God's way. We focus on creating a culture where Christians are given opportunities to mature in their understanding of God's mission in the world while discovering and developing their gifts (1 Corinthians 12:4-7). We want to be a church known for its encouragement to all members to prayerfully consider exploring and entering Christian ministry wherever the Lord leads. Our resolve will include ongoing spiritual and practical support especially for those who move beyond local ministry.

These, 'Our Values' and 'Values Explained' documents will, in the near future, appear both on our website and be strategically placed around our buildings to be a reminder to ourselves and newcomers what's important to us. I hope that we will all seek to commit these values to memory even if it's just the key words: Prayer, Word, Love, Evangelism, Mature, Team and Train/Send/Support. My prayer and hope is that these seven values will become , if they are not already, second nature to us. Our values should shape our culture. Values are also a filter for assisting the church's leadership to make decisions and prioritise the church's ministry and budgets.

To all those who have contributed to the process of shaping and editing these biblical values I express a deep gratitude. I believe these seven fundamental Scriptural values will be a great help to us as we move forward to become all that God wants us to be in Christ, and His ambassadors in West Penmant Hills and beyond. I commend these values to us all and encourage us to make them not just words on paper, wall and website, but qualities and practices which profoundly shape who we are and what we do. I for one will, with the help of the Holy Spirit, strive to make it so.

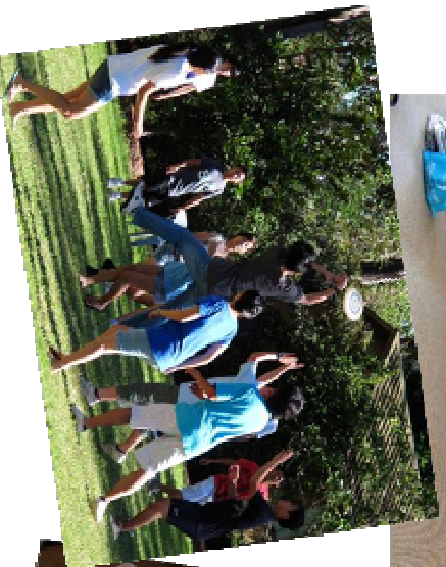

We had a wonderful time at the church camp at Stanwell Tops. Everything at the camp site was so organised and tidy. We had our own block of accommodation with two meeting places provided. The weather during those few days was just fantastic which added to the joy of the stay.

Some went to the beach, some stayed for a quiet walk around the camp site, and some young people had a go on the outdoor setup “Giant Swing” provided by the camp site. One can imagine what the “Giant Swing” was like. Well, you could have got a good idea when you saw some of the faces which were “frozen” after coming down from the swing.

One of the highlight of the camp was the variety show on Saturday night when we were divided into small groups. Each group had to do a special performance of their own and it had to be related to the camp theme “growth in God's word.” All groups were serious in preparing for their performances and the seriousness finally made way to lots of fun and laughter. After seeing all the performances, we had to admit that God is so amazing in creating people of different styles and gifts. It was wonderful to see that we were just like a big family enjoying our fellowship together.

We really have to give thanks for the success of this camp due to the hard work and co-operation of all brothers and sisters, and of course, to the providence of our gracious Father.

Electronic Giving



The traditional format of an Anglican service, and the usual practice at St Matt's, includes passing around the "plate" during the last hymn or song. If you have attended Anglican services at other churches (and even some St Matt's services), or services at other Christian churches, you might be aware of other practices, such as passing around a plate/bag in silence, without the accompanying music, or putting your contribution into a box at the entrance/exit to the church.

Why do we usually pass around the plate? For many of our members, it is part of their practice of worship, and an essential component of meeting together to praise God.

For others, the advantages of giving electronically are sufficient to encourage them to do so. Around 35% of our weekly giving is now done electronically.

What are the advantages of electronic giving?

- ♦ Your giving does not depend on your attendance. If you give electronically, it happens 12 months of the year, whether you are on holiday, or visiting elsewhere. This is good for our ability to plan financially as a church.
- ♦ Your giving does not depend on having the right number and colour of dollar notes in your wallet/purse. You are able to be prayerfully deliberate and reflective about the amount that you give.

What you do with electronic giving, is simply "instruct" your bank to deposit a certain amount into the church's account, on a regular basis. Most people choose to give monthly. You can select the frequency and amount of your giving, very easily, and to adjust this according to your changed circumstances.

If you want to know more about how to give electronically, there is a brochure available at the back of the church, or you can ask one of the wardens or the treasurer.

As your need is met, or as changes take place, you are requested to keep the team updated so that prayer remains appropriate and accurate.

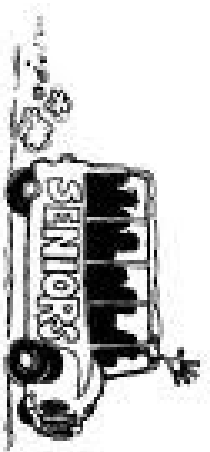
At no time will you be approached by team members over prayer issues, other than the Co-ordinator who may contact you to ask for progress reports, or Pastoral staff who may care for you.

Zimbabwe Short Term Mission Trip with Steve Abbott

In 2000 I attended an international Billy Graham Conference in Amsterdam where I met Reuben Zivagwe (picture on left) who was the leader of Living Word Ministries in Zimbabwe. The Living Word ministry continues to exercise a significant holistic gospel work over many parts of Zimbabwe, including the capital Harare, villages and rural areas, although the work's operational base is in Harare. Over the past 10 years as a supporter I have received many invitations to visit their work but have not had opportunity. However, along with 3999 other delegates and with the Wardens and Parish Council's blessings, I will be attending The Third Lausanne Congress on World Evangelization, to be held in Cape Town, South Africa, 16-25 October 2010. Immediately after this I will fly to Harare to conduct a week long (October 25-1 November) information gathering and short-term mission trip with Reuben and The Living Word Ministry.

Over the past 2-3 years, St Matthew's has provided some financial support for this ministry. For example we have recently assisted them in repairing their very tired truck (see picture below) and four of us paid for Emmanuel, Reuben's son to have necessary surgery for which Reuben and his wife Chiedza could not afford to pay. Reuben is very keen to have us come to see their work first hand and provide whatever encouragement we can to their ministry.




Below are some comments he sent me in response to my request about a short-term trip:

"WHAT WILL YOU DO?"

The primary focus of each project is frontline field evangelism. But we also conduct a lot of discipleship ministry as well. Therefore, we need people who can preach, teach, sing, play instruments, perform on a drama team, conduct Pastors' Conferences, lead soul-winning seminars, work with children and generally be ready to give practical help (eg. Visit Orphanage – see picture above). If you meet any of the basic qualifications mentioned above, then there is a place for you here. One thing you can be sure of is that you will NOT be sitting around doing nothing.

I am hoping to be able to have 5-10 people join me in Zimbabwe for this trip. I've been assured that Zimbabwe is actually safer than South Africa due to the very strict regime of President Mugabe within the country. I have lots more details to share but this is not the place to do so. I'm inviting anyone who has even the vaguest interest to come to an information discussion night at my place, 1 Trinity Place, Cherrybrook on Monday 14 June 7.30pm where I will provide more detailed information. 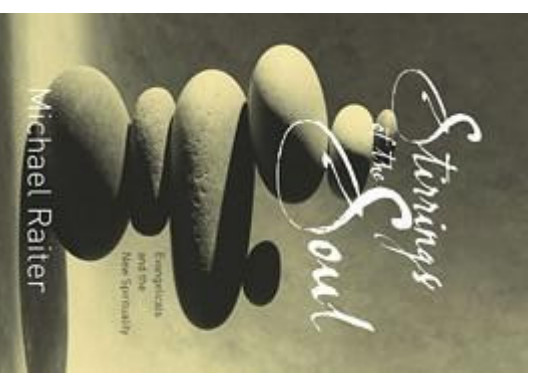
Book Review for *Stirrings of the Soul* by Michael Raiter Cost \$ 16.95

A former missionary in Pakistan and currently head of the Department of Mission at Moore College, Raiter writes to analyse Spirituality in 21st Century Australian culture and offer some guidance as to how Christians, who regard themselves as evangelicals, should respond to the challenges and opportunities it presents.

Starting with the explosion in spirituality in our culture, Raiter first defines spirituality, looking at the rise of contemporary (consumer) spirituality and its innate appeal. He then examines the tradition of spirituality in Christian/Church history, with a particular focus on the Christian mystic tradition and its links to the charismatic movement. The book concludes by seeking to define true Christian spirituality and offers some words of encouragement and counsel to the evangelical culture of which he is a part--Sydney Anglicanism.

Both well researched and written, Raiter successfully balances the difficult task of maintaining an appropriate degree of academic rigour while communicating at a level that the majority of readers can understand and absorb. There is also a refreshing humility -- while critiquing the world around him and highlighting the dangers of Christian traditions, he very helpfully identifies the dangers inherent within his own Sydney Anglican heritage.

This critique is very helpful in alerting evangelicals to the ways in which they can rob true Christian spirituality of its vitality and attractiveness to a world that is clearly spiritually hungry and seeking spiritual truth.
