


Book of the Month **ONE STEP AT TIME** Robyn Claydon

Pastoral Letter—Shane Dirks

Reflecting the generosity of Christ in and to our community.

Many businesses, groups and churches have put their minds to the task of constructing a ‘vision statement.’

For some this has been a ‘me too’ exercise that amounts to little more than a sign being made and the redesigning of a letter head. For others the vision statement becomes a part of their corporate and even personal DNA, a purpose and drive that they get out of bed with. After a night of dreaming about this very thing, it directs priorities, resources and passions! The Vision becomes their life’s conviction. As a friend of mine once told me a belief is something you hold, a conviction is something that holds you!

An example is Walt Disney’s vision ‘To make people happy.’ How many suspense thrillers have you seen produced by Disney? Ever been to ‘Disney Dentist Chain’ – On the other hand, I am sure you know what happens to a child’s face at the very mention of Disneyland or the movie Toy Story. The Vision directs what they do. But was everyone asleep at the wheel when we allowed the vision statement ‘Reflecting the generosity of Christ in and to our community’ to be the catalyst for our parish members’ dreams, and the banner under which our priorities would be set. I am serious; have you considered just for one moment the ramifications on our personal and corporate life together in the event that we adopt this vision as DNA and not only as something to model our stationery around? Allow me to elaborate.

Generosity is an elusive creature in the wild, often confused with the similar-looking though unrelated, and rarely named creature ‘social contract.’ The theme song of my favourite television show Friends could be offered as the theme song of social contractarianism, as it declares under the guise of friendly generosity: “I’ll be there for you, ‘cause you’re there for me too.” The generous heart sings ‘I will be there for you, ‘cause...’ and struggles to complete the phrase – beyond being a simple motivation of the heart. Generosity is a posture of giving, of other-centeredness without a thought of a return and a loose regard for one’s own interest. Our situation has the potential to go beyond this...

We have prescribed a particular kind of generosity. The generosity of Christ! Let me share what you already know but may have kept in a safe compartment; I know I'd like to! The giving nature of Jesus was unlimited and it was hands on. The Generosity of God is a tremendous thing, but as we narrow the scope to the second person of the trinity, God's generosity is seen in its sharpest light. For it was he who prayed with anguished tears in the garden, he who committed his Spirit (his life breath) to the Father as he died. He who, though in very nature God generously gave up heavenly splendour to be the slave who generously offers himself as a ransom for many. The nature of Jesus' generosity was that nothing was left for himself, it was given over – you can make a generous contribution, but Jesus' Generosity is not a contribution – it is a Ransom, a Substitutionary Atonement! He has paid the lot, and it cost him the lot! Are the alarm bells going off yet?

There are two more words in the vision that, understood well, should cause alarm; 'In' and 'to'. I am concerned because not only is there a challenge in reflecting generosity TO – which I can do at arm's length but IN – and this means being IN!


St. Augustine described the Church as a 'city within a city' and I think he is right. St Matt's exists within West Pennant Hills, and under this vision would be willing to compromise its very existence for the sake of blessing the community. Under this vision St Matt's personally and corporately, would have to sacrificially, yet joyfully look to the interests of the community. That could look like jeopardising my stipend for the sake of funding an outreach event! That could mean I would need to develop not only as a preacher but as someone who understands and studies wider demographics in order that I might generously offer Christ's truth in a way that speaks to a people who are not like me! That might mean..... for you! (I will let you fill in the space)

Are you starting to see why this is a terrifying and potentially personally destructive vision. No right-minded financial institution would ever adopt this! To give this more than ‘me too’ lip service could cause radical change in my life. If our leaders make their decisions, heart and soul, based on this vision people will surely leave! No intelligent person can read the vision, ‘Reflecting the generosity of Christ in and to our Community’ ponder it and not be made to feel a little sick. It’s precisely this feeling that inspired me to become a gospel partner in this parish. Anything that pushes that hard against my sinful heart is nothing short of inspirational!

At this point in time the best way for us corporately to reflect the generosity of Christ in and to our community is by expanding our mission activities in children’s ministry and by consolidating the advances made in youth ministry. Youth and Children’s ministry is in many ways one of the most complex areas to minister in effectively, yet also is one the most effective ways to minister broadly to a demographic such as ours. The time is now for all who are committed to the vision, to consider tweaking our prayers, considering our emphasis and adjusting our giving in order to support another gospel worker in the form of a Youth and Children’s Associate Minister. Let’s begin to reflect!

St Matt's Wardens' Update

Financial Matters

The Scriptures provide a lot of teaching about how Christians should handle their money but the prime motivation for giving is God's generosity to us: 2 Corinthians 8:7 '*For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.*' Our giving ought to reflect our gratefulness to God for his '*Indescribable gift*' (2 Cor 9:15).

We ask each of you to review your offertory giving, not grudgingly but out of gratitude. We ask you to prayerfully consider whether you can increase it and make it regular, knowing that the request for planned, regular giving is actually a request for the support of gospel ministry in West Pennant Hills.

As indicated in the Financial Update given in all services in August, the average giving per adult across all our congregations is about \$20. Some people give regular and planned amounts, whilst it appears that others do not. Some give more on occasion, but it is a problem if their giving is not regular and/or not planned. This may be because of irregular attendance, and not prayerfully considering the amount that is given.

What can we all do?

- Pray that God will give us all generous hearts for his work at WPH.
- Whether your giving is via the plate or is electronic (internet or bank) make it a regular payment. For electronic giving, monthly seems best for most people.
- For those who give electronically, it would be very helpful to identify your regular church service on your payment transfer (8, 9, 10, 5, 7, Chinese, Asian, Wed). For those who would like to give electronically, the enclosed form provides you with the bank account details for St Matthews. You can set up the payment yourself over the internet, or ask your bank to do it for you. To use your credit card, simply fill in the details and leave the form with the office.

Other Matters

- Our next working bee is 27th November, 8am to 12noon.
 - A larger and better designed new fridge has been purchased for the kitchen, to replace the old one which had stopped working.
- The New Line Cottage Ramp is now completed and the cottage is fully accessible to the community. A formal opening is planned for early 2011.

OH&S

Are you interested in OH&S (Occupational Health and Safety) matters? This is a very important area of our governance that needs attention.

The wardens would like someone at St Matt's with such an interest to undertake OHS reporting and communication on behalf of the parish council. It involves keeping an eye on OHS matters at St Matt's, reporting these and our policies to the diocese, and keeping the wardens and parish council up to date on changes as notified by the diocese. It is a responsible position but does not involve frequent reporting, so it would suit someone who is retired or who has full-time family responsibilities.

Giving Encouragement



The Bible instructs us to encourage one another, and at times we all need to be encouraged by others. Paul, in writing to the Romans said: "I long to see you so that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to make you strong - that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith" (Romans 1:11-12). Encouragement helps us to have confidence, it builds us up and helps us to press on when we might otherwise feel that we are going nowhere.

One of the greatest encouragers was a man from Cyprus names Joseph. He was so inclined to encourage others that the early church members changed his name to Barnabas, which means, 'son of encouragement'. One of those occasions of encouragement was when Barnabas brought Paul to the Apostles soon after he became a Christian, and stood by him when others were still wary, because they weren't sure that Paul could be trusted.

Later, Paul too was an encourager. How uplifted Timothy would have been when he read Paul's letter to him which said in part.... "night and day I constantly remember you in my prayers" (2 Tim.1:3).

Sometimes when people need encouragement and help, prayer is all that we can give, indeed it is the best that we can give.

Do you know someone whom you can encourage? By prayerfully seeking God, he will bring opportunities before you to speak a word 'in season' or to pray fervently for the needs of others. Let us begin by encouraging one another as we meet together today at Church and then let us take encouragement to others as opportunities open throughout the coming week.

What is CJ Day?

We have offered Chris Jones (CJ) the position of Associate Youth and Children's Minister from 2011. To be sure that we can pay for this expansion of our ministry team, we want to have "the money in the bank" prior to 2011. So our usual "C Day" appeal at this time of year is now "CJ Day".



What is C Day?

For those new to St Matts, for many years we have held a "Contribution Day" (shortened to C Day) each year at about this time, to raise funds for paying off our debt, or to send to our link missionaries, and so on. In 2009, we raised funds to employ Nerida in 2010. It is an opportunity for us to give a lump sum of money as a reflection of God's generosity to us in giving us all that we need (and much more).

Why do we need to employ an extra person?

Both our youth and children's ministries need additional time to allow them to grow and to continue growing. CJ's appointment will bring the combined hours of two part-time children's ministry positions to the equivalent of a full-time position, with the advantage of the skills and experience of two different people. This is needed to work with children of all ages across our different congregations. With the youth work, our program has grown beyond the size that can be safely and effectively managed by one person, and CJ's appointment will enable it to continue to grow and to reach youth at other high schools in our area.

So what is happening on 13 November?

A fund raising dinner is being held, to raise funds! We have a limited capacity in our halls for a dinner, and so tickets are being sold for \$5 each to ensure that those who take a ticket turn up on the night. The \$5 will be refunded at the door - it is not part of the fund-raising effort. There will be an auction of items and services, to raise some of the funds needed and to have some fun on the night. But the real purpose is to raise funds (cash, cheque or credit card), so the dinner is for those who are willing to contribute an amount of money on the night to employ CJ in 2011.

The evening starts at 6.30pm (arrival), followed by dinner, the auction, interviews and talks. We aim to finish by 9.30pm. A night of fun and fellowship is planned, with a serious purpose as well. Tickets are available from Sunday 24th October after each service.

What if I am unavailable on the night?

If you want to contribute to the CJ Day appeal before 13th November, you can place money (cash or cheque) in a clearly marked envelope in the offertory prior to 13th November, or you can make a direct debit to the church accounts, again clearly indicating the purpose of the deposit.

Please join us in praying for this event, and the expansion of God's kingdom in our local area that will occur as a result.

Young Adults Mid Year Teaching Series

Ethics – the Shape of the Christian Life

As the second semester of University started, the Young Adult Home Groups gathered for 6 weeks every Tuesday night. Why? Not just to eat great food, hang out and get to know each other. But also ... to listen to some great teaching on various topics of Christian ethics. “What is ethics?” as someone asked the first week. It is how we should live well as Christians – what decision should we make in any given situation - what the shape of the Christian life should be. And often this involves hard theological thinking, rather than just trying to read the rules and keep them (deontological ethics!), because very often situations don’t fit clearly into an ethical command such as “don’t steal” or “don’t kill anyone”. So – firstly we looked at a framework for ethics – how to think ethically and theologically, and Stuart Heath of the Porterbrook network led us through this. The two main questions he got us to ask were, as we look at a particular topic, we need to think about what the Bible says the “Nature of something is” (what is it?) and also “what is its purpose” (what is it for?). And that these two questions help us navigate the wilds of Christian ethics, whether it is money, family, euthanasia, or sex. The following week Stuart led us through the example of how to decide who to get married to – which some of the Young Adults were VERY interested in!



Justine Toh, a lecturer from Macquarie University then helped us look at the Ethics of consumerism, and how we should battle with the overwhelming culture that we live in of advertising and marketing. On to issues of addiction and then sexuality with our very own Shane Dirks – the man who is candid, straight forward, and very challenging and helpful on these topics. Then we finished up with the ethics of greed and poverty with John Beckett from the Micah Challenge which is a Christian organisation that works to alleviate world poverty.

The feedback from the Young Adults on this series was great – they enjoyed all the different aspects of it – the teaching, the fellowship, the food! So ... we will be making it a regular part of our calendar for all Home Groups.

Please pray for our Home Groups as they get to the end of the year – most flourishing, and a few limping! Please pray also for the Year 12s who will join us soon – that they will integrate quickly, and that none of them will fall away over the Christmas period, which is quite common.

As I sit in my office I am afforded one of the most amazing views. Each day I get to see the true heart of St Matt's and the wheels that make it move. Without fail each day there is a multitude of people showing their servant hearts using their gifts to serve God in unpaid ministry. The ministry of these people encourages me immensely and so I don't want to keep it to myself. Come on a journey with me and meet some (and I stress some!) of these gracious people who do so much without any want for praise.

On Monday mornings I always come in to find my office light on, curtains open and, if it's cold, air-conditioner on. My friend Pat is always here ahead of me, starting the many tasks he commonly spends Monday mornings patiently doing. He finalises the paperwork for the banking and reconciles the tally sheet, he cleans up anything left in the entryway and halls, puts away tables and chairs left out, and he cleans out any paperwork left in the pews and neatens all the books. He is always willing to pop up any other day and help out.

On Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays every week the ladies of Cubby Club grace our halls. This ministry brings through our doors weekly great opportunities to proclaim Christ's love to many non-Christian mothers and kids who come because it's such a good playgroup. Each week our groups share Christ through conversations, activities and sharing their lives. The backbones of this outreach are the tireless mothers and "grandmas" who organise and run the activities and morning tea, as well as the other St Matt's mums who come and share their lives.

On Wednesdays the lovely Charmaine is here, she helps set up for the Wednesday service and then does any admin tasks I have for her. Also on Wednesdays are the lovely morning tea ladies, those who set up communion for the service, those who play the piano or organ, those who do sound and also count the offertory.

Fridays are the busiest days, as preparation for all of the Sunday services is completed. There are the never tiring Debbie and Marion who are here each week making sure there are enough copies of the bulletins, songs and any other print outs for everyone. There are the many ladies who come and clean the church, sharpen the pencils and insert any flyers into the bulletins. Also, the patient Linda or Geoff is here to set up the slide show for all the services.

I realise as I leave on Friday afternoons and don't return until Mondays I don't get to see the youth leaders, Sunday school teachers, crèche helpers, band members, sound people, data projector people, service leaders, morning tea helpers, those who set up communion, those who pray during and after the service, those who welcome, those who count the offertory, bible readers and many more tasks. Then there are those who at different times in the year do tasks like help at Matts 4 Kids, do database updates, organise camps, organise the working bees and other maintenance to the church, co-ordinate rosters and many other tasks that I'm unaware of.

How encouraging is it that so many people serve St Matt's with their time, gifts and energy? I know I find it inspiring and makes me wonder which of these I could give to my church. I know there is always more to be done at St Matt's, and space for more to serve. Have you considered where you could serve?



Barraba Mission Review

On Sunday the 26 September our family (Hellstrom's) and other families from Cherrybrook Anglican Church drove out to Barraba in NSW, which is roughly 6-8 hours away from Sydney. Most of the families stayed in the caravan park, or the Playhouse Hotel. We arrived on the night of the bush-dance, which was a BBQ dinner and dancing to socialize with the people of the town. We had a lot of other opportunities to get to know the Barrabians (the nickname for the people of Barraba) during the Mission, which included church on Sunday morning, kids club, youth events, women's and men's events, and the footy event – as well as the dinner on the Friday night. We arrived at the church in the early morning (around 7:30am) for bible study and prayer. Compared to St Matt's, West Pennant Hills, St Laurence's in Barraba is quite a small church with few people (or youth, for that matter). I was a leader for the Kindergarteners with Sophia (Cherrybrook Anglican) for the Kids Club, and we had about 5 kids who turned up for the three days, with about 35-50 K-6. Kids Club ran from Wednesday to Friday, and I believe that the kids from Barraba had quite a lot of fun with it. The youth events were on Tuesday and Thursday – the Thursday event was probably the most fun, as we met most of the kids who go to the youth. Rebecca (also from Cherrybrook) gave a talk and a testimony. We talked to the nine Barraba youth who turned up, plus a couple of the youth from Cherrybrook, as well as my brother and myself; it was all a lot of fun. The most rewarding part of the mission was definitely seeing God work in the hearts of the children at the kids club, and the youth of the town at the youth event. It's safe to say that you definitely grow in your faith and learn so much more about where you are with God during your time on mission.




