## Senior Minister's November 2012 Pastoral Letter – Matt's Matters

Dear sisters and brothers,

The current series of sermons on Romans 1-8 focusing on expounding the gospel of God's Son, has come at a wonderful time of the year. We are moving rapidly towards Christmas and the reminder that the promised Christ child would be called Jesus, because he would save his people from their sins. The birth of Jesus is in some ways the birth of the gospel, the gospel Paul is explaining in Romans.

Christmas is one of those Christian high points of the year when it's probably easier than any other time to share our faith and to invite our family and friends to church or special gatherings. I'm especially thinking of our annual Carols by Candlelight at West Pennant Hills Public School oval, which this year will be held on Friday 21 December, and also our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Services.

The Romans series so far has provided massive encouragement and motivation to step out of our comfort zones and to speak boldly and prayerfully about the message of the Christ child, who was born to die on a Cross and to rise from death to wear a Crown. According to Romans 1-8 the Cradle to Crown story is one people outside of faith need to hear. It's a message that is effective, necessary and generous.



Some key truths about this gospel include:

- In Romans 1:16-17 we were reminded that the gospel is God's power to save from sin everyone who believes. There is no one for whom the good news of Jesus was not designed and relevant. The gospel isn't dependent on our cleverness or the power of our communication skills for its effectiveness. No, this lies in the fact that it possesses God's own power.
- In Romans 1:18-3:20 we recall that everyone is under the power of sin and judgment; the wrath of God rests upon them. All people outside of faith in Jesus Christ are in a desperately lost state because they are guilty before God and have no excuse or defence to justify themselves before God. How can we who know the gracious forgiveness of God and have come to possess eternal life keep this to ourselves? Surely the logic is clear that those who know the good news tell those who don't know.

- Romans 3:21-31 explains the heart of the gospel. Jesus' death is a gift of God's grace and generosity; it cannot be earned. The Cross not only brought us full forgiveness, it also brought us into a right relationship with God. His anger was turned off and his love turned on. So many people have swallowed the lie that salvation is earned by good works, religious duty, etc. We can explain the wonderful news that it is by faith alone in Jesus that people can be assured of a righteous standing with God.

- Romans 4 confirms this via two of the giants of the Old Testament: Abraham and King David. They testify to the great truth that wicked, spiritually dead, sinful people can be credited with God's own righteousness.

- Romans 5 introduces some of the great fruits of the justification found in the gospel: peace, hope and joy. Fruits, which lost people search for in material things but find they are constantly disappointed. My sisters and brothers, let's explain where these abundant fruits can be found, and that is in the good news of the dying and rising Christ Jesus.

I could of course go on but I hope the point is already clear. This gospel of Jesus Christ is wonderful news for a world which has lost its way and is all too often distracted by the temporal over the eternal.

As we move towards Christmas may we be praying for opportunities to courageously share our faith in the Gospel of Jesus: noting especially His Cradle, Cross and Crown. Let's boldly invite our pre-Christian family and friends to come and hear the message at Church or a special event. And let's ensure we pray that the Spirit of Power will transform minds and hearts so that people welcome Jesus into the control centre of their lives.

When people visit the church or participate in church activities, they need to feel they're in a safe and caring environment.

At St Matthews, we believe the way we care for our visitors, our congregations, our volunteers and our ministry team is an expression of our commitment to the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. We demonstrate our care by addressing those issues that may cause personal harm – and compromise our mission to 'reflect the generosity of Christ'.

Risk management is in essence love in action. It's an expression of one of St Matts' core values: 'unreserved commitment to love people impartially'.

Our program aims to ensure that we:

- provide a safe environment for gospel-centred ministry
- protect people as well as the assets and reputation of the church, and
- comply with our legal obligations.

### **We can all contribute**

The wardens and parish council encourage all members of the church community to be aware of risk.

Each month we plan to highlight a specific aspect of our MattSafe program in this bulletin. Please look for this information and read it carefully. If you see something that could pose a risk to people's health or safety, please bring the matter to our attention. Being aware of risk is one way that we 'look out for the interests of others' (Philippians 2:4).

Like to be involved in helping us implement the program? Just let a member of staff know. We are looking for someone from each congregation to be part of the MattSafe team.

## 60 Seconds with a Warden

### Rob McGregor

1970 was a fateful year. Rob had the privilege of teaching his wife-to-be Chris in 3 Unit Ancient History at Inverell High School in northern NSW. Rob and Chris were engaged when Chris later came to Sydney (UNSW) to study drama. Rob and Chris will celebrate 40 wonderful years of marriage in April 2013.



After 10 years in State education, Rob taught English at Barker College Hornsby for a further 10 years – though one of those years was spent at the University of Exeter, UK.

In 1994, Rob left teaching to become a consultant writer, information designer and researcher and now helps government and big business to communicate more effectively with clients and customers.

The 1959 Billy Graham Crusade had a profound influence on Rob – as did Scripture Union camps, ISCF at Normanhurst Boys' High and Sydney University Evangelical Union. Books like John Stott's *Basic Christianity*, Harry Blamires' *The Christian Mind* and the writings of CS Lewis, Francis Schaeffer and Os Guinness helped Rob deal with the big questions of life.

Rob and Chris live in Epping – OK, not exactly St Matts' territory – and have been in a St Matt's home group since 1996. Rob says, 'It's great to know that there are people who are committed to sharing, learning, caring and praying for you and your family through all the ups and downs of life. If anyone is not in a home group I encourage you to talk to Steve Abbott or another member of staff about finding that regular fellowship. It really makes a difference.'

## STORIES OF RECONCILIATION



On Saturday night, 27 October, St Matt's was privileged to be the first of many speaking venues across Sydney, for 'Stories of Reconciliation' from Mr Rory Steyn, former bodyguard to President Nelson Mandela of South Africa, who shared moving accounts from that period!

Rory's speaking engagements have been sponsored by Anglican Aid: a ministry of Sydney Diocese, and its head, Rev. David Mansfield, co-presented with Rory. David helpfully explained three important areas:

- The work of Anglican Aid both in Australia and overseas in training, development and aid for those in needy and strategic circumstances.
- Essential South African background information to Rory's presentation, including movie clips from 'Cry the Beloved Country' and 'Invictus'.
- Interviewing and introducing Rory about his family and background history.

Rory's presentation was vivid, personal and powerful, as he began by importantly affirming for us that 'Invictus' was a very accurate portrayal of Nelson Mandela, the events and people of the time. Interwoven in the presentation, Rory shared about South Africa in 1995, the character of Nelson Mandela, and his own personal perceptions. Many riveting points included: the obvious racial tensions existing when Nelson Mandela was elected President; Mandela's extraordinary personal touch to communicate forgiveness and acceptance to White South Africans, including Presidential staff who expected to be dismissed, only to be asked to stay and continue serving. Also, the same conciliatory attitude to White South African police who formerly mistreated Black Mandela supporters.

As Rory honestly shared about his initial racial prejudices against Mandela and other Black activists, which was typical of the upbringing of many White South Africans. He changed to having a deep respect and affection for Mandela, and warm outlook towards other South Africans. This was coupled with sharing his own spiritual journey in coming to personal faith in Jesus, and the powerful reality of Christ earning forgiveness for us by his death on the cross. Rory ended by inviting people to pray a prayer of response, to give their lives to Christ.

A wonderful supper awaited us afterwards, which everyone enjoyed.

Feedback cards overwhelmingly indicated people's enjoyment of the night, including wanting Rory to share even more, as his presentation could have been longer! Some have indicated they prayed the prayer of response, and would like to be contacted.

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**MISSION AID GROUP or A MINISTRY OF THE GOSPEL (MAG)**

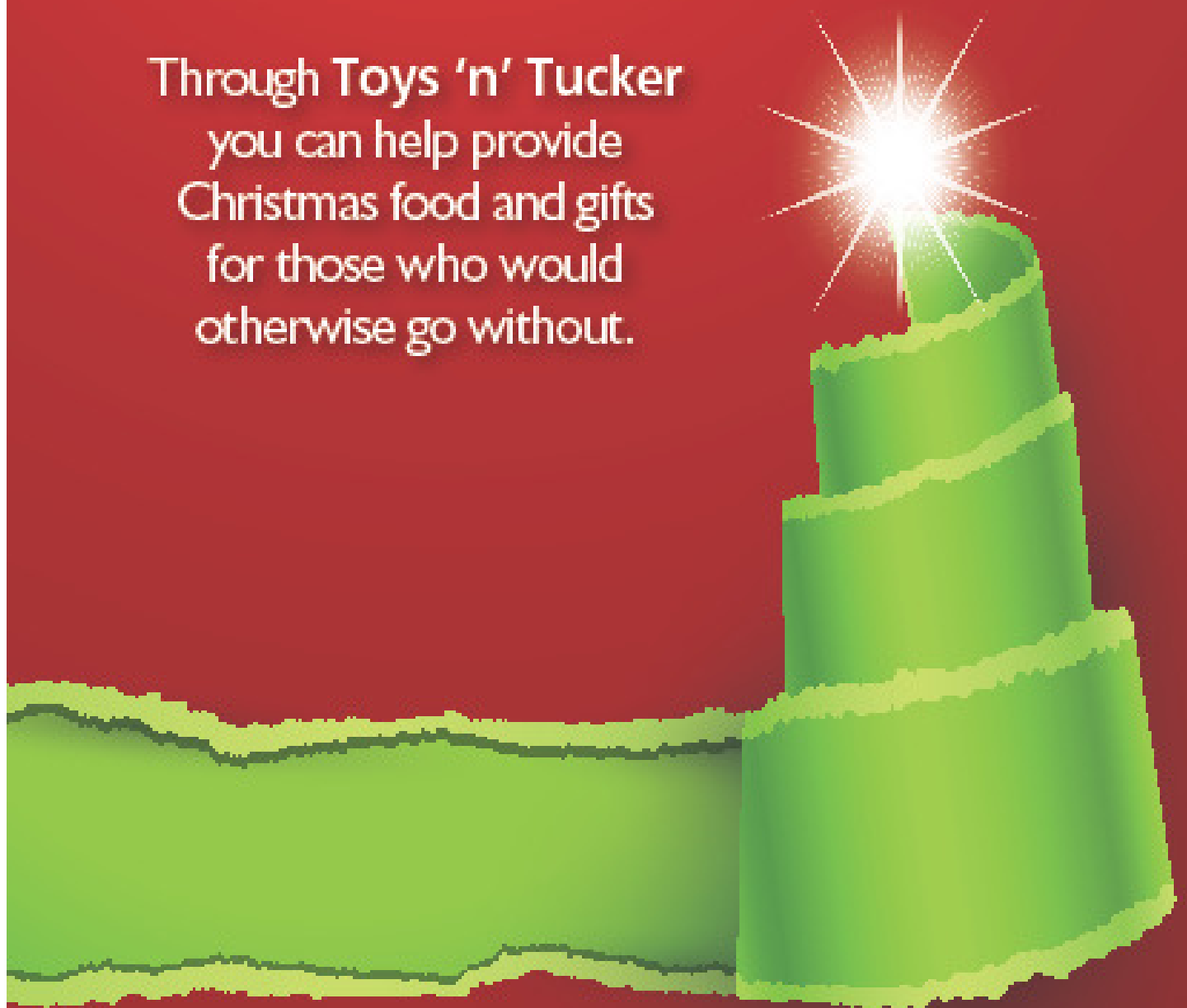

They were able to visit several CMS missionaries and to see their work first hand and give some extra rugs, jumpers, books, etc. to these people. They saw many of the items MAG sends being used and worn in the theology college, schools, sewing groups, etc.

**Suggestions for this month are:** empty biscuit tins for sewing kits, sewing needles and cottons, small sewing scissors, personal soap (non-scented), baby soap, black socks (children's or adults) 8 ply wool (acrylics are fine) for jumpers and squares, any stationery or toiletry items. ## ST MATT'S STAFF NEWS

The New Testament refers to the church as a household: fathers, mothers, sisters and brothers, in Christ. Therefore, when sad and unfortunate things happen in the St Matt's family I believe it's right and appropriate for me, as the overseer, to be transparent so you can pray appropriately in an informed manner.

It grieves me to inform the St Matt's family that on Sunday 30 September our probationary Chinese Minister Ken Wong formally announced his resignation. This was due to an irreconcilable breakdown in relationship with the leadership and other members of the congregation. This only came to my attention around the sixth month of his ministry. It appears that Ken's leadership style and pastoral manner have been the major cause in the breakdown of communication and relationship with the majority of the existing Chinese leadership and several members of the congregation. Clearly, the collapse in relationship within the church is far more complex than pointing the finger at one thing or one person. It needs to be said that both Ken and I have done all in our power over the past 2-3 months in order to bring about mediation between the disillusioned members and Ken. However, it was impossible to organize such a meeting, which was hugely disappointing to both Ken and myself. Chinese culture was a significant factor in this, yet without mediation there was ultimately no way to address the issues and move positively forward.

Consequently Ken resigned and I've sadly had to accept. It would have been intolerable to expect an inexperienced minister to attempt to lead a church where he had lost the confidence of the majority of leaders and significant numbers of the Chinese congregation. On Sunday Ken finished with dignity and good grace by reading a letter of explanation, which gave expression to his personal disappointment, an admission of his mistakes, an apology and a commitment to pray for the congregation. Please pray for Ken, Winnie and their two boys Jeremy and Jonathan. This has been a very difficult time for them all and their future is of course uncertain. Our wardens have generously committed to paying him until the end of November and we've been able to set in place two sources of pastoral care and support, one from the Diocese and the other a Chinese Minister. I would also ask you to please partner with me in praying for God to bring good out of this very difficult outcome; good for the Wong family, and for the Chinese Congregation.

I also need to announce that Rev Bill France, part-time Pastoral Care and Seniors' Minister and John Carr, Ministry Trainee have both informed me that they will not be continuing in their positions in 2013. They will both be missed as they have done excellent ministry and we thank God for them. Bill reports that he enjoyed his role at St Matt's but decided not to continue beyond the year he'd committed to, because he has a real heart to do more locum roles in North West Australia. These local church oversight roles provide a wider variety of opportunities for him to use his various gifts for ministry. John Carr also decided to cut his time down to one year as he was already convinced that he wanted to pursue fulltime ministry in the future. Therefore, he desired to finish his original degree, get some work experience and then move towards theological training for ministry sooner rather than delay another year. These departures will leave some ministry holes to fill and so I will be exploring, along with others, the most effective way to proceed. Please pray for wisdom in this whole process.

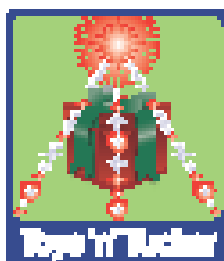
