Senior Minister's February 2013 Pastoral Letter – Matt's Matters

Dear sisters and brothers,

Welcome back to all those who have been on holidays and a special welcome to those who have only recently joined St Matthew's over the Summer months, we're delighted to have you as part of our Christian community. I hope we are all ready to commit to another year of '*radical discipleship*' within the life of our fellowship and our local community.

Last year we introduced the idea of an annual central theme or focus for the year and in 2012 it was 'Radical Discipleship: Going deeper in order to grow stronger'. We want to continue this practice and after some personal prayer and reflection, followed by discussion with both staff and parish council, I can now reveal our 2013 theme:

Radical Dependence: Practicing a persistent joy-full, prayer-full and thank-full life in Christ.'

The biblical foundation for this key focus for 2013 is 1 Thessalonians 5:16-17 '*Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.*' I'm hoping that we'll all commit this text to memory and more importantly put it into practice so that we give daily and corporate expression to the '*Radical Dependence*' upon God that our Lord God calls us to.

Prayer, talking with our Almighty God, who we know as Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is the most basic expression of our dependence upon God. We see this in the teaching of our Lord Jesus who taught us to pray the Lord's Prayer, which succinctly and clearly articulates our dependence upon our Heavenly Father for all our basic obligations and needs: the praise of his name, the promotion of his kingdom and will, daily provisions, personal pardon and protection. As John Piper has written, '*Prayer is the open admission that without Christ we can do nothing. And prayer is the turning away from ourselves to God in confidence that he will provide the help we need. Prayer humbles us as needy, and exalts God as wealthy.*'[Desiring God, p.133].

I'm currently reading, 'A Praying Life' by Paul E Miller and I'm finding it refreshingly challenging. Touching on this theme of the believer's dependence he writes, *'Prayer is bringing your helplessness to Jesus. Thomas Merton the Trappist monk, summarized it beautifully: "Prayer is an expression of who we are... We are living incompleteness. We are a gap, an emptiness that calls [to God] for fulfillment."*' [p55]. This is of course consistent with Jesus' own teaching from Luke 11:9

'So I say to you: Ask and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you.' It's clearly because we are not complete in so far as we have unanswered questions and needs, we can't find our way and doors are closed to us that we need to ask, seek and knock. But what an encouragement to pray continuously Jesus provides in the next verse: Luke 9:10 *'For everyone who asks receives, the one who seeks finds; and to the one who knocks the door will be opened.'* So 'radical dependence' is fundamental for our personal walk with Christ in this broken and spiritually corrupt world. To reiterate Piper, we are needy and God is wealthy.

But make no mistake, it's not just individual believers but also the local and global church which is completely and utterly dependent upon God for its effectiveness. No wonder the Holy Spirit - inspired Apostle Paul made prayer the first priority of church assemblies. We read in 1 Timothy 2:1- *'I urge then, first of all, that petitions, prayers, intercessions and thanksgiving be made for all people... This is good and pleases God our saviour who wants all people to be saved... for there is one mediator between God and mankind, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all people.'* The universal scope of this prayer 'for all people' flows from the fact Jesus has died 'for all people', and therefore we ask God to do what his desire is, 'to save people' because we cannot do this in and of ourselves. Again let me quote Piper, *'The point of prayer is empowering for mission.'* (Desiring God, p147).

So it will be our challenge in 2013, both individually and corporately to embrace **'Radical Dependence: Practicing a persistent joy-full, prayer-full and thank-full life in Christ.'**

As in previous years we will have four special times of prayer but this year there will be two days of prayer, one evening of prayer and one Saturday prayer breakfast, check the calendar for the dates. We'll kick off our special prayer occasions on Tuesday 19 February with a prayer night in St Matt's church, please make every effort to be there. We have also chosen 3 books, which will appear as Books of the Month as the year proceeds. I hope you will purchase and read them. In closing let me remind us all that '*Unrelenting prayer to God*' is our first value, which makes this year's ministry focus doubly appropriate. Therefore, it will be my prayer that our gracious and generous God will make St Matthew's a 'Radically Dependent' Christian Community in 2013, which would make our first value a reality in practice not just a statement on paper!

Prayer Points

- Ask the Lord to stir many to attend our first quarterly prayer gathering a 'Prayer Night' at St Matt's on Tuesday 19 February from 7.30-9pm.

- Pray that Steve will lead our church with a dependent servant compassionate heart, a wise discerning mind, a deep love of people and an enthusiasm for the glory of God and his gospel.

- Pray for Steve's preaching on Romans, that the messages he prepares will reflect the truth of God's Word with clarity, creativity, passion and relevance.

Pray also that God's Spirit will use them to transform us all into being Christlike people.

- Pray for Sue that she will commend Christ in both her role as Medical Receptionist Monday through Wednesday and in her many support ministries at St Matt's: hospitality, crèche, Bible Study, etc.

MISSION AID GROUP (MAG)



St Matthew's Policy for Conflict Resolution

Handling Leadership, Congregational & Small Group Conflicts

Preamble

Given that everyone is different and still sinful it is inevitable that conflicts will, from time to time, occur within the life of the Christian community. When they do we need to respond biblically so that Satan does not get a foothold and bring lasting and deep division among his people. Therefore, at St Matthew's we seek to respond to conflict using the following principles and process:

Principles

Humility - A conflict situation may be the result of factors you are not aware of. Consider whether you or other injured parties may have contributed to the situation - or may be overreacting. Ask someone not directly involved for their view.

Graciousness - In approaching the other person, listen and be gentle. Check what their expectations may have been. It may be that there has been a huge misunderstanding. Be open to a compromise or agreeing to disagree.

Patience – We need to recognise that deep conflicts take time to resolve. Be content with small steps. Review your own behaviour before God at each point.

Prayer – *'If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you.'* (James 1:5 NIV)

Process

1. Talk first to the person face-to-face. This is always the best first step.
2. If there is no resolution or you feel uneasy about approaching the person directly, approach the Congregational Minister or the Senior Minister for assistance.
3. If you feel uneasy talking directly to the Congregational Minister or the Senior Minister, speak to a member of the Church Committee or Parish Council and ask for someone to go with you.
4. If there is still no resolution, the Congregational Minister or the Senior Minister may arrange a mediation meeting with the person. This meeting will involve the person, one or two others who understand the issue, and either the Congregational Minister or the Senior Minister. It is important to keep the group small.
5. Should no resolution be forthcoming after these steps, a decision will be made by the Senior Minister in confidential consultation with relevant church staff and/or Church Wardens.

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth... God created mankind in his own image... God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it." Genesis 1:1, 27-28





Book of the Month **Before the Throne of God**
