


Book of the Month

Senior Minister's July/August 2012 Pastoral Letter

Dear sisters and brothers,

The winter months have well and truly hit, it's a season when people spend more time in the warmth of their homes, for the daylight hours are shorter and the nights much colder. In the winter season people therefore withdraw, at least somewhat, from the world, indeed many retirees physically head north to find some warmth, others schedule holidays and also head for warmer climates, while the majority probably watch a little more TV, especially in an Olympic Games year. In contrast, snow 'bunnies' rug up and escape to the alps, making the most of the relatively short snowboarding and skiing season. Interestingly, in the Christian Church winter also tends to be a quieter season for ministry, with the calendar less busy than the other three seasons.

I wonder if a subtle spiritual danger may exist in this seasonal trend? Is it possible that believers could be tempted to spiritually hibernate, to pull back from the radical call of discipleship our Lord Jesus makes on our life, 'Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me.' (Luke 9:23 my emphasis)? Clearly, there is never a day when authentic Christians, of whatever generation, can put on hold their walk of faith. Each and everyday is another opportunity to respond as Hebrews 12:1-2 urges, 'Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith.' The language here, brings to mind the Summer Olympics, from which we can learn some spiritual lessons.

In a few weeks much of the world will be caught up in watching 11,000 athletes from 205 nations participate in 300 events at the 2012 Olympic Games in London, England. They will walk, run, jump, swim, pedal, stroke, throw, leap, balance, dive, shoot, punch, kick and tumble their way to win a medal and the adulation of the crowds and their nation. Yet what we watch and cheer on the screen is only a fraction of the story unfolding before us. We ought to recall an important very powerful principle: for every minute an athlete performs in public they train thousands of hours in private. The authentic serious athlete understands that without the time, grind, sweat, pain and even injuries that come with training prior to the games the few fleeting moments in public will be unimpressive and bring no possibility of success.

The same is true of the Christian race of faith. The capacity to respond ('perform') consistently with the fruit of the Spirit in our daily relationships at home, study, work and play is proportionate to the amount of time and energy we spend in the following:

- The passionate pursuit and enjoyment of time alone in intimate fellowship with our Creator, King and Father.
- The commitment to be an active, regular participant in a HOME or Community Small Group, where God's Word is studied, prayer is offered, care is given and compassion for the lost is expressed.
- The prioritizing of church, so that non-attendance is the exception, rather than the pattern.

Without these regular spiritual disciplines we find our eyes get turned to the things of the world and we become distracted from running the Spirit empowered race as Jesus our role model did.

The Apostle Paul provides a stiff challenge for believers when he explains his own training regime, clearly as a pattern for his readers: 'Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last forever. Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize.' 1 Corinthians 9:24-27.

May this winter season see no spiritual hibernation but ongoing spiritual discipline. Therefore let's ensure we don't run 'aimlessly' but bring our behaviour under the control of the Holy Spirit, so that in all we say and do publicly and privately, we bring home the gold for God and his glory.

WEDNESDAY CHURCH, SENIORS AND PASTORAL CARE UPDATE



Our Wednesday Morning Tea and Midweek Service continues to prosper and we would like to share the experience with others!!!! It features:

Pastoral Care Focus July and August.

The three week sermon series in July on the biblical bases for pastoral care and the four week course in August arose out of the concern of the Pastoral Care committee that pastoral care was seen as:

- a. something that older people needed
- b. something that required specialist training
- c. a specific gift that only some people had

While accepting that in certain cases and situations each of these things is true, it was felt that we needed to encourage all church members to recognise their responsibility to care for those around them and thus seek to equip themselves better to do so. The better equipped each of us is, the less likely those in need will be overlooked, and the more winsome the ministry of Christ will be. Christians are people on a journey together - the road is narrow (Matt.6:13-14) there are twists and turns, sometimes the terrain is flat but at other times it is steep and rock-strewn - often we need help, and there are times when we see others struggling too.

Or to use another analogy, Christianity is a life of convalescence: brought back from the dead, born again, and now in the process of being restored to the likeness of Christ, as the Holy Spirit administers the 'antibiotics' of God's word, putting to death the old ways, and the 'vitamins' and 'tonics' of that same word to enliven Christ-like characteristics.

The sermon series provides the biblical warrant for being there for one another in the journey - about "nursing" each other in the convalescent process.

The August course is about clarifying our relationships and equipping us to care where we are - it is not aimed at 'specialist' care - it is about better enabling us to live within the mutual relationships we have with one another as fellow members of the Body of Christ - the human face of Christ in the world today: "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." John 13:34-35. What does it mean to "love one another as Christ has loved us"? What does this look like in practice?

40 Hour Famine ~ 17th-19th August 2012

Have you ever had a vision to make your world better? Well, 7 year old Burtukan sure has. She is a young beautiful girl in Ethiopia who is one of the feature children in this year's 40 Hour Famine. She shares her world with us, and the way she loves to play with her friends – serving "coffee" and other traditional delicacies. Unfortunately for Burtukan, her play is make believe, as she and her family are living on about \$1 a day for a family of five, that works out at only 20c a day per person...



One of the great things about the 40 Hour Famine, is that it allows Burtukan to share her very own story with us in Australia and the vision she has for a better life – where she and her family can flourish. By working with World Vision in Ethiopia, Burtukan's family can strive to achieve improved livelihoods through access to education, training, health care, safe water and other necessities, which often prove difficult to find in remote rural villages.

Last year I was blessed to be able to go to East Timor and visit children like Burtukan – although in a different culture in a different part of the world, many families face the same restrictive poverty, but I was able to see the benefits of sustainable investments that helped to transform whole communities! It is for this reason that I am proud to passionately support the 40 Hour Famine, because it really is doing something real to fight hunger and poverty around the world.

St Matt's has been doing the 40 Hour Famine for many years, and it is something which Steve Abbott and the ministry team, as well as many church members, have been doing or supporting, and so we thank you for that. Last year we had over 80 people do the 40 Hour Famine, and together as a church we raised over \$11,000! Thank you for being a part of this. It is an excellent way in which we can put our faith into action, being a light to people all around the world, including our own local community.

This year, we again expect many people from youth and other services to participate in the 40 Hour Famine, and we would love to encourage everyone to get involved by at least praying for and making a donation towards someone who is doing the 40 Hour Famine. We will also be focusing on a Christian attitude towards poverty and justice issues at Youth in term 3, learning about the issues and how and why we, as Christians, should be active in our faith. We will also be having a special event for all our services during the Famine weekend. Stay tuned for more details!

Zimbabwe Mission Trip is coming soon...please pray for us!

Team: Pat Sutton, Pamela Webster, Jack and Zara Packham, Mark Simons, Nigel Woolley, Steve Abbott.

Dates: 1- 9 September, 2012. Pamela Webster is staying an additional week. At this stage she is hoping to give some training for those in Prison Ministry in the Harare area as they don't have Kairos Ministry there yet.

Who With: Reuben and Cheizda Zivagwe under the banner of their ministry 'The Living Word Ministry'.

Where: Mufakaso Baptist Church in a suburb of Harare (6 nights in local Harare hotel), Nenyunga Area (probably 2-3 nights) in an isolated and very poor community in the Zambezi Valley which is about 400kms from Harare. Mark, Nigel and Steve will stay in the village and the ladies and the Packhams will stay in a hotel in Gokwe about 20 Kms away.

Ministry: We will do some teaching, preaching and sharing of testimonies. There will also be surprises and we'll need to be ready for last minute ministry.

The Zivagwe's have given us lots of good advice in the lead up to the mission trip, such as

"Worship is a big event in many cultures. You may be sitting on a hard bench for several hours or under a tree during the heat of the day. Be prepared for anything!"

4. Feeding programme (time to share some food stuffs with poor communities)

Focus on 'August Focus'



Over the past few years it has been our practice to run teaching and/or training sessions during the four Monday's of February. However given February was always a busy start-of -the-year month we decided in 2012 to move the 'Focus' to the four Mondays in August. Hence we'll be running three excellent opportunities for personal growth in knowledge and practical obedience as we address the following significant topics:

- **Everyday Care** - The August course is also a home grown product and is about clarifying our relationships and equipping us to care where we are - it is not aimed at 'specialist' care - it is about better enabling us to live within the mutual relationships we have with one another as fellow members of the Body of Christ. It starts with the biblical mandate, moves through an overview of mission in our world, then examines local and global mission in practice and concludes with a session entitled Mission: How to Get Started.

All of these courses have excellent practical content and I hope that all of our HOME and Young Adult Community Groups will support this August Focus along with everyone else from our parish family. Small Groups could choose to stay as a group and join in one of the courses or split up across the three courses so that the members of the group can later share their respective insights.

Each evening will commence with light refreshments and fellowship from 7.30pm and the courses will commence at 7.45 and run through to 9.30pm. There will be a one off small charge of \$10 per person to cover the cost of the supper and printed materials for each course. However, because 'Everyday Evangelism' is a published manual the charge will be a little higher at \$15.
