



# Pastoral Letter—Steve Abbott

Dec-Jan 2010/11

Dear sisters and brothers,

The end of another busy year of life and ministry is rapidly drawing to a close but not with a whimper. The Christmas season affords us all countless wonderful opportunities to testify to our allegiance to our Lord, Jesus Christ. I hope you will join Sue and me in reaching out to your family, neighbours and friends, inviting them to participate in at least one of our scheduled outreach events; they are all listed on our Christmas postcards. We have lots of additional postcards available for us all to use as invitations to the various gospel activities, so feel free to take a bundle and pass them on.

For various reasons, one particular verse has been occupying my thoughts in recent weeks and I'd like to briefly share it with you. 2 Corinthians 8:9 reads '*For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich.*' The context is the Apostle Paul's encouragement to the Christians of Corinth to provide financial support for famine relief for the Jerusalem church. He is using this wonderful sentence to inspire generosity based on the generosity (grace) the Christians know they have in Jesus. As with so many other things, if we want to know how to respond to life's challenges and circumstances we will always do well to contemplate the person, practices and priorities of Christ. This is an especially apt text for us to pause and reflect on in the Christmas and New Year season. It was because of humanity's spiritual poverty ('*dead in sin*') that Christ renounced the riches of glory, so that through his poverty we might become spiritually rich ('*righteous in Christ*'). The poverty that Christ embraced began with the incarnation ('*The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us*', John 1:14) but climaxed in the cross (*My God, my God why have you forsaken me*', Mark 15:3). God's glorious eternal Son embraced both human flesh in becoming a baby and human sin in becoming the one and only sacrifice for the world's sin in his crucifixion. It is by this poverty you and I and all other Christians stand showered with the riches of full and complete salvation. There can be no greater inspiration for being generous with all of our resources: treasures, talents, time and our testimonies, than the person and passion of Jesus Christ. May Christ's poverty inspire us all to spend all we are and have for his glory and his gospel.

Christ's poverty is worth celebrating as Paul does with a spontaneous outburst of gratitude at the conclusion of his discussion in 2 Corinthians 8-9: '*Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift.*'



Speaking of celebrating and knowing our next Matt's Monthly won't be until February, I want to ask you to put a very significant date in your diaries for 2011. On the early evening of Saturday 19 February we plan to have a whole parish celebration where we'll share a meal together, participate in a wonderful time of corporate worship, creatively celebrate the many blessings of 2010 and cast the vision for the year ahead. We plan to make this an annual combined congregational event. We get so few opportunities to get together across our congregations and the reality is that most people know very little about congregations other than their own. What a great joy it will be to step back and look at the larger canvas of our St Matt's family and hear and see what God has been doing to build his church among us. We have booked Cherrybrook Community Centre for the event and it will be for the whole family. I will be approaching people in the next week or so to join a committee to assist in planning this event with the hope of a meeting prior to Christmas and then several more from mid-January on. Please pray that we'll be able to pull together a great team to organize this event and that this 'Celebration of God's Work' among us will receive wide support across our Christian community.

Can I say a huge thanks to the Staff, Wardens, Parish Council and the cast of hundreds who have served our church throughout 2010. It has been my wonderful privilege to oversee this ministry but without your ministry there'd be very little to oversee. I thank God for you all. To all the members of St Matt's, Sue and I wish you a Christmas where the grace of Jesus Christ floods your inner being afresh so that you infectiously overflow with joy and thanksgiving. Finally for those of you travelling over the school holiday period please drive carefully, have a safe and refreshing break and return ready to give yourselves to fulfilling our St Matt's vision '*to be a church which reflects the generosity of Christ in and to our community, in 2011.*

Our total giving for the month exceeded our budget by \$3,776 (6.4%). This was a much better result following a very disappointing October when our giving was down on budget by more than \$10,000. # CJ DAY 2010

## Fundraising Dinner & Auction

**FUN:** This was indeed a fun night. Great live music, a good dinner for only \$5, a clear sense of God's spirit among his people who were a cross-section of all services and ages and cultures, an entertaining auction, laughter, chatter, and some memorable moments.

Moments like Evelyn and Sandra competing for the auction of "The Ultimate Man" to do handi-work around their houses – in the end they both won, and the men are generously doing two sessions. Or like the young adult women and the young adult men bidding for a "date" with one of four young men. Rumour has it that Rob Conway's idea of a "date" was someone to bath his young children! But luckily for the four guys, Rob was outbid. Nerida Peart is now the proud owner of a lightweight surfboard. Shane Dirks' pile of firewood will be a little smaller after several bootloads were purchased on the "silent auction". And someone paid \$140 for a \$30 iTunes voucher.

**MISSION FOCUSED GENEROSITY:** Everyone, whether they donated or purchased or just made a bid, was responding to the advice at the start of the night to give generously, over the value of what was being received, because the point was not to get a bargain but to give to support gospel ministry. And from those donations, about \$15 000 was raised. We all paid too much and were pleased to do so.

**CHALLENGING TALK:** After the fun of the auction, Steve challenged us to pledge a lump sum of money. We were challenged to give in response to God's generosity to us, to enable us to send another worker in to the harvest field, that is children and youth work in our local area. He asked us to focus not on how much we were giving but how much we were keeping for ourselves, in recognition that everything that we have comes from God. From pledge cards given on the night, another \$25 000 was raised. So we raised 50% of the total needed.

**BUILDING COMMUNITY:** Events like the CJ Day Dinner do not happen without the support of the St Matt's community. We had over 60 items offered for auction, a team of about 20 people setting up beforehand, buying and preparing food, serving and cleaning up, as well as many up-front roles like interviews, talks, music, auction and MC. As the organizer I can confirm that it was not run perfectly, but it was a pleasure to co-ordinate so many willing and cheerful people.

**SUPPORTED BY PRAYER:** We know that without prayer, nothing good can be achieved. This event was prayed about for many weeks beforehand, as well as on the night. God blessed our gathering, and the glory goes to him.




## Friday Morning Ladies HOME Group

## A Young Adult Bible Study Experience

**7.15 pm - Tuesday Night.** tired and cranky after a day at work, Julie and Dave grab bibles, etc, and race off to jump in the car... it's Young Adults Bible Study. It can't possibly be a whole week since last Tuesday, can it? Couldn't we just stay home for one Tuesday night?

**7.31 pm - Tuesday Night.** The group arrives close to time...it's amazing. Already we feel encouraged. Within the next minutes we are laughing our heads off, counting our blessings and are so glad to be there. What an extraordinary privilege it is to share in prayer and bible study with adults 25 years younger than us! They are warm, enthusiastic, knowledgeable yet enquiring, caring, committed and .... hilariously funny.

Already our attitude has changed ... and we are feeling 20 years younger ourselves. This sure beats vitamin tablets .... and staying home on a Tuesday night.

There are several Young Adult Bible Study groups at St Matt's and this is just one of them. We meet weekly, though in August all the groups joined together for a month long Ethics series. Many also attended a weekend in the mountains for the "Engage" conference, specially catering for young adults. We enjoyed our weekend with them but are still coming to grips with everyone else reading the Bible on their iPhones, whilst we are searching for our glasses. The music was joyful and loud ... we can do LOUD!



It was quite a surprise that we found ourselves leading a Young Adult Bible Study group in 2010. It wasn't part of the plan, but sometimes God has other ideas and we are so very thankful. The energy of youth is such a blessing and we have absolutely LOVED joining them at 7pm church as well. It has all reminded us to really appreciate the 'younger generation' and not to hold on to the ways we do things but to be prepared to learn from them.

Meeting monthly with Nerida and a committed and enthusiastic team of Godly leaders has also been a wonderful experience. To our surprise we have been included by them and it is us (rather than the youngies) who have been most conscious of our age.

**9.45 pm - Tuesday Night.** We go home each week rating young Adult Bible Study as one of the best things we have done for years. Despite feeling totally out of our comfort zone and often ill-prepared, each week with our group is fabulous and we have not only ministered but have largely been ministered to. Meeting and growing with adults in the bumpy transition from school to work, seeking to know God deeply and honour him in their lives, has been enriching and encouraging for us.

Please pray for the young adult groups, the leaders and Nerida as she directs this important ministry at St Matts. God is good!

# 'Out of Africa' Report

Steve Abbott & Craig Reid

I am so very grateful for the opportunity to attend the Lausanne Congress for World Evangelisation in Cape Town and then to participate in the week long mission trip in Zimbabwe, where Craig, our part-time ministry trainee, joined me. This was my first trip to the African continent and in very different ways these two experiences allowed me to step back from focusing narrowly on St Matt's and look at the wider canvas of God's activity in the world today. I returned having been challenged, stretched, encouraged, stimulated and disturbed; no doubt you'll probably get sick of my sharing of stories so just get your violins out when this is the case and I'll bag my head. On 13 December, at St Matt's, Craig and I will present PowerPoint slides and maybe some short movie clips and share more extensively about our time. However here are one or two highlights and pictures:

- **Cape Town Lausanne Congress:** This third congress for world evangelisation was incredibly encouraging and the diversity of the world church is a joy to behold and experience. 4,200 participants met each day in table groups of six (see picture below) to discuss the Scriptures and various ministry issues. I shared my table with 5 ministers from Trinidad & Tobago, Ghana, Nigeria, Hong Kong and the USA it was a rich time. There were wonderful oral and visual presentations, moving testimonies and the singing & dancing was just great. My big reflection is that I was tremendously encouraged to see the hand of God growing his church in all the four corners of the globe from scholarly institutions in the West to the slums of India. Despite what we might feel when pleasure-seeking Aussies reject the gospel, God is on the move, building his church. Lausanne also reminded me of the challenge to work hard at getting the balance right between gospel preaching and meeting the real social needs of the people hearing the preaching.



- ◆ **Zimbabwe Short Term Mission with Living Word Ministries** – The Zivagwe family (see picture above) lead this ministry and they welcomed Craig and myself warmly. We were able to get some feel for their ministry in Harare in their depressed and poor suburban Mufakose Baptist Church where we preached and taught on the last Saturday and Sunday. The city is very run down and the first thing you really notice everywhere in the city and, I might add, the rural communities is that nearly everybody walks as there are so few people who can afford cars. Our rural trip took us about 25km beyond a town called Gokwe, which is close to the Zambian border in an area called Nenyunga. Here we stayed two nights and three days based in a family village, where I did a lot of teaching and preaching while Craig did an invaluable work in getting their Jesus Film equipment operating more safely and also spoke at two school assemblies (see picture). Reuben mentors four rural pastors (see picture), who serve the local villages and have no formal theological training and receive no money for their labours. Despite this they serve with enthusiasm and joy; it was a privilege to meet them.



Just one reflection: We have so much to learn from these wonderful Christian brothers and sisters whose joy in Christ is not obscured by wealth, prosperity and our many toys of entertainment. Their commitment and dedication is a great example to us and I'm the richer for being in their midst. I hope and pray that in 2011 we might be able to have another short-term mission trip with Living Word Ministries but this time with up to 16 people so that we can actually do more practical things to assist them.

Tuesday nights are one of our favourite nights of the week – undistracted time to pray and enjoy fellowship with Christian sisters, and to grapple with putting God's Word into practice. There are now about 20 women who meet for coffee and supper, and then break into 2 smaller groups for Bible study and prayer. The group is unique with its diversity in age and length of time as a Christian. Also women exploring Christ for the first time are welcome and feel comfortable in asking questions.

Although it would be nice to meet in someone's home, we are keen to keep meeting in Hall 1 in the church building, so that we can be flexible and have room to grow.

This year we had noticed that for many of us it's a struggle to develop our own personal quiet time alone with God, so we have tried some different things:

- ◆ we read the book of James together using the same basic framework each week (the SOAP model – Scripture, Observe, Apply, Pray), instead of set Bible study questions. This helped us all become more confident in our own ability to read Scripture for ourselves, trusting in the Holy Spirit to help us.
- ◆ we also used Matthias Media's *The Daily Reading Bible* notes to help guide our reading of John's gospel, and we encouraged each other to read several readings at home before the next week's Bible Study.
- ◆ In an effort to increase our pastoral care for each other and to hold each other accountable, we formed "prayer squares" within our Bible study groups – these are made up of 4 women who consistently pray with each other each Tuesday night, and who care for/email prayer points and check on each other at a more open and intimate level. We have all loved and valued these deeper prayer relationships, and plan to keep them going next year.

It's wonderful to be part of this group, made up of both 9am and 10am women, as we share our lives with each other and encourage each other to keep following Jesus.

Please pray for more wisdom in planning for next year, and that more Bible study leaders will be raised up and trained in leading groups.




